#### What is Layered Quality Auditing?

- Auditors from
  - Any organizational level
  - Cross functional support team
- Not a QA owned program
- Everyone is responsible for Quality
- Set audit frequency for the "layered" auditors
- Set performance objectives for the different layers of responsibility

## Introduction

#### Relevance to root cause analysis:

## The Adventure of the Empty House

"Ah! My dear Watson, there we come into those realms of conjecture where the most logical mind may be at fault. Each may form his own hypothesis upon the present evidence, and yours is as likely to be correct as mine."

- We can all conjecture; but we can't really know without verifying our conjectures.
- The good Dr. Watson would probably be the one who leads a team in creating a prioritization matrix to vote on the most popular root cause.

## T15 - ISO 9001:2015: Implementing Risk-Based Thinking



#### Risk Assessment – Qualitative

Unlike the Quantitative approach, which uses a numerical ranking to determine risk levels, a qualitative approach is based more on "gut feel" and does not follow a scoring guideline for determining where risk mitigation is required.

This presentation uses a "Risk Assessment Table" as a way of capturing the thoughts and decisions of the group performing the assessment
